






How did we get here?

No mention of dispossession





Referendum requiring a double-majority of voters



Majority of voters must agree

What are the changes we are being asked to support?

Constitutional recognition through a voice

Obligation on government to create a body called the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice

Make representations to Parliament and Executive Government related to First Nations





In recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples as the First Peoples of Australia:

- There shall be a body, to be called the Aboriginal and Torres
 Strait Islander Voice;
- The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice may make representations to the Parliament and the Executive Government of the Commonwealth on matters relating to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples;
- The Parliament shall, subject to this Constitution, have power to make laws with respect to matters relating to the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice, including its composition, functions, powers and procedures.




